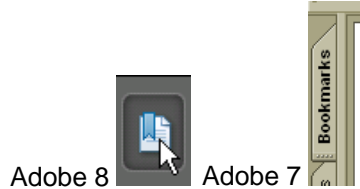

Using the Schedule of Classes PDF

- **Bookmarks -**

Bookmarks in Adobe Reader allow immediate access to topical and course subject headings in this document. If bookmarks do not automatically appear to the left, you may open them using the Bookmark button at the left of the Reader window or clicking the menu item View – Navigation Panels – Bookmarks.



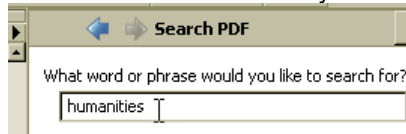
- **Searching -**

There are two primary ways to search the PDF.

- Find or Ctrl+F is particularly useful if you know the subject and catalog number of a course, for example SPM 315

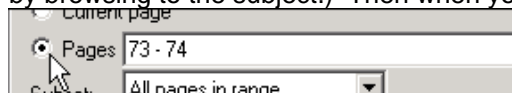


- Search or Ctrl+Shift+F may be more useful if you want to browse for a subject or topic of interest.



- **Printing -**

- You can easily print an entire school or college's class listing by opening its respective PDF from the SC page.
- If you want to print a single subject, first determine the page numbers for that subject (using the index or by browsing to the subject.) Then when you print enter the desired page range in the print dialog.

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Syracuse University requires students to provide current addresses, phone numbers and other contact information to facilitate timely communication on matters of interest to students and prompt communication in emergency situations.

Once each Fall and Spring semester, students are required to verify and/or update their contact information. You can at any point in time update your information in MySlice.

Student Rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Syracuse University fully complies with the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and with procedures recommended by the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers. This legislation gives students the following rights with respect to their education records:

I. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the University receives a request for access.

Students should submit to the University Registrar (106 Steele Hall, Syracuse University, Syracuse, NY 13244-1120) written requests that identify the record(s) they wish to inspect. The University Registrar will make arrangements for access and will notify the student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

II. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the student believes are inaccurate or misleading.

Students may ask the University to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading, although this does not include challenges to the accuracy/fairness of grades in courses or any other assessment of academic performance. They should write the University official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the University decides not to amend the record as requested by the student, the University will notify the student of the decision of his or her right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment, and of the hearing procedures. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the student when notified of the right to a hearing.

III. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. Specific exceptions include:

A. *School officials with legitimate educational interest.* "School official" means:

1. a person employed by the University;
2. a person, company, or agency with whom the University has contracted for a service; or
3. a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

"Legitimate educational interest" means an educationally related purpose which has a directly identifiable relationship to the student involved and is consistent with the purposes for which the information is maintained. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if, in the judgment of the data custodian responsible for requested information, the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. The information sought and provided must be pertinent to and used within the context of official University business and not for a purpose extraneous to the official's area of responsibility. Release of a student's education record to a school official having legitimate education interest does not constitute institutional authorization to transmit, share, or disclose any or all of the information to a third party, within or outside the University.

B. *Officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll,* upon the request of such officials.

C. *Parents of a dependent student as defined by the Internal Revenue Service.* A "parent" is a parent, guardian, or someone acting as a parent who meets the IRS standard. Undergraduates at Syracuse University are assumed to be dependents of the parent(s) they list on application materials unless they prove otherwise. Divorced or separated parents will be provided equal access unless the University is provided with evidence of a court order, state law, or legally binding document that specifically revokes those rights. Graduate students will be presumed to be independent of their parent(s) unless the parent(s) provide their most recent IRS tax return with evidence to the contrary.

D. *Appropriate parties in connection with an emergency* if knowledge of the information is necessary to protect the health or safety of the student or other individuals.

[Note: Students should refer to their individual school/college(s)' policies concerning parental notification in cases of academic misconduct and academic performance issues.]

IV. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by Syracuse University to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

V. The right to prevent disclosure of personally identifiable information that Syracuse University has designated as "Directory Information."

At its discretion, Syracuse University may provide "directory information" in accordance with the provisions of FERPA. Directory information is defined as that information which would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. Designated directory information at Syracuse University includes the following:

*Asterisked items are printed in the University's telephone directory.

Students may block the public disclosure of directory information (all or in part) by filing a Request to Prevent Disclosure of Directory Information form with the Office of the Registrar, 106 Steele Hall. Although the initial request may be filed at any time, requests to prevent disclosure will be honored by the University until removed, in writing, by the student. To prevent asterisked items from appearing in the University's annual printed telephone directory, students must file the request form within the first two weeks of classes in the fall semester. Requests filed after this deadline in the fall semester will remove designated directory information from the online directory and in subsequent years' printed directories.

If you select an option to prevent disclosure of some, but not all, directory information, additional action must be taken to prevent release of information regarding athletic participation and for announcements of academic achievements to your hometown newspaper(s) and/or printing in the annual *Register of Graduates*. Filing of a Request to Prevent Disclosure will also prevent information from loading to Blackboard, an online course management system used in many SU classes. If you are required to use Blackboard for a class or multiple classes, additional action must be taken. The Registrar's Office will provide information about these additional steps.

Students should very carefully consider the consequences of a decision to prevent disclosure of Directory Information. Regardless of the effect upon students, the University assumes no liability as a result of honoring instructions that such information be withheld. Syracuse University assumes that a student's failure to specifically request blocking access to any element of directory information constitutes approval for disclosure. Opening Weekend Registration:

Sunday, January 17

This registration is for **new, readmitted, and transfer undergraduates only** (no returning undergraduates) and **any (new and returning) graduate students** who need to register for Spring.

Late Registration:

Tuesday, January 19 – Tuesday, January 26

Returning undergraduate students who did not register by December 21, 2009, and **graduate students** who are not registered prior to **Tuesday, January 19**, must register during this late registration period. Undergraduate students will need to receive **bursar clearance*** in order to be eligible to enroll. You will either receive information in the mail or have to contact the Bursar's Office for clearance. *Hint: When preparing to register, if Spring 2010 is not displayed as an enrollment term, contact the Bursar's Office.

A \$50 late registration service fee will be charged to all late registrants' accounts. The \$50 late registration fee will be waived only if the late registration is a result of an administrative delay caused by the University. Waiver petition forms are available at the Office of the

Registrar, 106 Steele Hall. Return completed petitions to the same office. Late fee waivers can be granted only by the Registrar's Office.

Schedule Adjustment at Beginning of Semester:

Tuesday, January 19 – Tuesday, January 26

Schedule adjustment is for adding, dropping, or changing sections of your current schedule. If you have not registered, you ARE a late registrant as described in Late Registration section.

Trouble Shooting Tips

Cannot see Student Services section: Within the orange header of MySlice there is a Content link. Click this link. The MySlice content page is displayed. In the middle of the page is a pagelet with section names listed with check boxes to their left. Click into the check box next to Student Services. Click the SAVE button at the bottom of the page. The MySlice homepage is re-displayed and the Student Services section has been added. If the Student Services section is not a selection option, contact the ITS help line at 315-443-2677.

Timeout: There is an inactivity timeout on the web. There will be a warning message displayed after 55 minutes of inactivity, "Your session is about to time out." After 60 minutes of inactivity, MySlice will "timeout", logging you out of the portal. A dialog box will be displayed with the message: "Your session has ended". Click the OK button and log out of your browser. Restart your browser and re-enter the URL myslice.syr.edu to login to MySlice using your NetID and Password.

Auto enroll: One part of a course is automatically added to your schedule when you register for the other part. When you drop the enrolled part, both parts are removed from your schedule.

Review/Update Contact Information: Students are required to provide current addresses, phone numbers, and other contact

information to the University. Twice each year students, excluding SUNY ESF students, will be prompted to review their contact information before access to Student Services on MySlice will be granted. Contact information may be reviewed and updated in MySlice and selecting any of the links in Student Services section. You will automatically be forwarded to the items which must be reviewed. You may also select the relevant item(s) in the Personal Information section. Students who wish to prevent the release of address and telephone information should refer to the "Student Rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act" in this publication or at :

registrar.syr.edu/students/ferpa.html. Students must file a Request to Prevent Disclosure of Directory Information form with the Office of the Registrar, 106 Steele Hall. Such requests may be filed at any time and will remain in effect permanently (including after departure from the University) unless a change is requested.

Related Part/Component: One course is set up with multiple parts. You need to select each part when registering. You will usually select the first section and then have to select from a prompt list of "related" class sections. An example is a class with two lecture sections and multiple discussion sections listed for each lecture. You must choose one lecture and one section that go together in order to register for the course.

Section Numbering: Numbering consists of a letter representing the campus where the course is offered; M=Main Campus, U=University College; and three digits representing the section: 001, 002, 034, etc.

Availability: MySlice is scheduled to be available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Regularly scheduled system downtimes will occur for various applications in the portal. Check Announcements on MySlice for advance notification of downtimes. The Information Technology Services (ITS) help line is available during regular University business hours at 315-443-2677.

Printing Web Pages: Click inside the open page. Select Print Frame from file menu. When prompted, click OK.

Scrolling and Moving: On some web pages you may have to scroll to the right or left to view all content on page. This is especially important to remember when building a large class schedule consisting of multiple-component classes.

NetID and Password: You must have an active University NetID and Password to use MySlice. You only need to activate your NetID one time. To activate your NetID and Password – your keys to the University's computing network – you can follow the simple steps outlined on the University's NetID web page, its.syr.edu/netid.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

You have access to view your enrollment profile via the Student Service section in MySlice by selecting the [View My Enrollment Profile](#) link. Once a student has been activated for a current or future term, the following academic information is displayed:

- Semester
- Career
- Projected level
- Program/College
- Plan Type
- Plan (Major)
- Sub-Plan

If any of the data displayed does not correlate with expected information, **please contact your home school/college to clarify any discrepancies.**

ELIGIBILITY: EARLY REGISTRATION

Undergraduates

1. Matriculated Returning students who are not graduating at the end of the current semester are eligible to register during the early registration period at the end of each fall and spring semester, provided all academic, financial, and immunization obligations have been met (see *-Registration Holds*).

Readmitted undergraduate students may participate in early registration after receiving notification of approval for readmission from Student Affairs, Office of Student Assistance, located in Steele Hall, Room 306. Also, the request for registration materials form must be returned to the Registrar's Office prior to the registration period. All holds must be cleared before registering. Readmitted students are also eligible to register during New Student Registration on **Sunday, January 17**.

2. Non-matriculated undergraduates, i.e., students not formally admitted to the University, who have not previously earned a bachelor's degree, must register through University College. Refer to the *Syracuse University College Credit Schedule* (yesu.syr.edu) for instructions. Non-matriculated students, who have previously earned a bachelor's degree at Syracuse University or elsewhere are considered non-matriculated graduate students and should follow the instructions below.

Grad FAQ's:

Q: (Zero Hour Registration) I am not taking courses for credit at SU this semester. How do I maintain my registration status?

A: *Students enrolled in graduate degree programs who are not registering for courses, i.e., scheduled classes, independent study, or other courses, including thesis or dissertation, must register for; GRD-998, "Degree in Progress." (Enter Class Number 45046 for Spring 2010) Registration for GRD-998 is also required for access to campus resources such as the library and computing services.*

Q: Can a Non Matriculated Grad Student enroll for Main Campus Courses?

A: Yes, *non-matriculated students may register for UC and/or main campus courses through UC, subject to course restrictions and space availability.*

Q: I am only taking extended campus classes, how do i register?

A: *Non-matriculated students taking only Extended Campus courses should register through Extended Campus. (Students taking other courses in addition to Extended Campus courses must register through UC.)*

Q: I am a non Matriculated Grad student do I have to register in person?

A. *Non-matriculated graduate students, i.e., students not formally admitted to a graduate degree program, but who have previously earned a bachelor's degree, must register through University College (UC). First-time students must register in person or by mail. Returning students may register in person, by mail, or online. Refer to the Syracuse University College Course Schedule (yesu.syr.edu) for registration information and dates.*

Law Students

College of Law online registration will occur in November. Dates and times for registration access and additional information about schedule adjustment will be placed into students' mail folders at the Law School prior to registration.

ELIGIBILITY: OPENING WEEKEND

New Student Registration

Only the following students are eligible to participate in main campus registration on **Sunday, January 17**:

- New full-time freshmen or transfer students from another institution or University College who did not previously register;
- Readmitted full-time undergraduates who did not previously register;
- New matriculated graduate students; returning matriculated graduate students who did not previously register.

ADVISING

Undergraduates

1. Schools and colleges require advising for some or all undergraduates before they are allowed to register. Advising policies vary among colleges, and for dually enrolled students the *home college's* rules apply. Each college's policy is managed by a college-specific "advising hold." You may access the information either through the Holds section or the View Holds link in the Student Services section. Home college advising policies are accessible on the Registrar's homepage, registrar.syr.edu. The "advising hold" will block a student's ability to successfully register for classes until it is removed.

2. It is essential that students make appointments to see their advisors **before** registration begins. It can take one or more business days *after* the appointment before the advising hold will be lifted. Registration cannot occur until the hold is lifted.

3. Prior to the advising conference, students should sketch out a set of first-choice and alternate courses on the Course Worksheet. A complete selection of alternate courses/sections should be entered on the worksheet in case any first choices are unavailable at the time of registration.

4. Depending on the home college's protocol for removing advising holds, students and advisors may be required to complete and sign the three-part Registration Advising Form as a record of the agreed-upon courses. Students may then be asked to take the signed Dean's Office copy to their dean's/departmental office to have the hold lifted. Or the advisor may communicate directly with that office to authorize lifting of the hold.

5. For courses that have restrictions (described in the "Comments" column for a course listing) or require special permission, students must contact the department of course origin to determine whether a permission number can be issued.

University College

Part-time students in the Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP) or those who hold one-term trial, UC special student, or probation status will be placed on advising hold. Students will receive a letter from the UC Student Administrative Services office two weeks before registration begins. Such students must meet with an academic advisor before registering. The letter will include directions for scheduling an advising appointment, or students can call UC at 315-443-3261. Registration cannot occur until the hold is lifted.

Graduate students

Students should plan their schedules in consultation with an academic advisor as necessary or as recommended by the student's department. All holds must be cleared before registration.

REGISTRATION HOLDS

If any of the following holds have been applied, it will be indicated on the student's View Holds section in MySlice and as a link in the Student Services section. Detailed information about the hold and procedures for removing the hold is available on the Registrar's Office homepage, registrar.syr.edu/students/registration/ and by contacting the home college. The student will be prevented from registering for classes. In order to register, students must obtain clearance from the holding office(s) indicated below.

Advising Hold

Schools and colleges require advising for some or all of their undergraduate students before they are allowed to register (see the previous section on "Advising"). Advising policies vary among colleges. For dually enrolled students, the home college's rules apply. If an advising hold has been applied, detailed information about the hold and procedures for resolving it are available via MySlice. You may access the information either through the Holds section or the View Holds link in the Student Services section.

Financial Holds

Students with outstanding financial obligations are placed on financial hold by the Bursar. Separate financial holds may be applied by the Bookstore, Student Debt Management, Library, and Parking. Other holding offices can accept payment but **cannot** enable registration. Contact the Bursar's Office to resolve holds. If a financial hold has been applied, detailed information about the hold and procedures for resolving it are available via MySlice. You may access the information either through the Holds section or the View Holds link in the Student Services section.

Health Center Hold

Proof of measles, mumps, and rubella immunity is required for all full- and part-time undergraduate, graduate, and law students born after January 1, 1957. Proof of re-immunization is also required for all students who were inoculated for measles and rubella before the age of one year or who were inoculated before 1968. All students must provide a completed response form relating to vaccination for meningococcal disease (Meningitis). Students who have a Health Center hold will not be allowed to register until they submit proof of immunization to Health Services, 111 Waverly Avenue.

Judicial Affairs – Prevent Registration Hold

The Office of Judicial Affairs can place a hold preventing a student from attempting to register until any outstanding judicial actions are settled. Students with this type of hold should contact the Office of Judicial Affairs, 304 Steele Hall.

Non-declared Plan (Major) Hold

While some colleges require earlier declaration, all matriculated undergraduates must apply for admission to and be accepted into a major program of study by the beginning of their junior year. Dually enrolled students must declare a major in both colleges. Students will

be placed on hold if they are registering as a second-semester junior but have not officially declared their major. Dually enrolled students must declare majors in both colleges for the hold to be removed. Students with this type of hold should contact their college(s) to officially declare a major.

OIS Hold - Slutzker Center for International Services

International students may be required to contact the Slutzker Center for International Services and present appropriate paperwork. Students should contact the Center at 310 Walnut Place to obtain clearance.

SCHEDULE CONFIRMATION

Graduate Students (except Law)

Schedules are considered confirmed at the time of registration. Bills for semester charges are mailed after classes begin.

Undergraduates and Law Students

1. The schedule completed during early registration is only TENTATIVE. It will be confirmed, and space in each class protected, only if the student pays tuition charges (or is current on the payment plan) by the deadline set by the Bursar.

2. REGISTRATION MAY BE CANCELLED FOR STUDENTS WHO DO NOT MEET THE PAYMENT DEADLINE. CANCELLED SCHEDULES WILL NOT BE REINSTATED. Registrations will also be cancelled for students who take a leave of absence or are withdrawn from the University.

Students whose schedules are cancelled:

- May not register until the first day of classes
- May be closed out of classes they had originally chosen
- A \$50 late registration fee will be assessed

REGISTRATION AND SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT IN SPRING 2010

SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT IN SPRING 2010

Undergraduate students **who enrolled during early registration** may resume online schedule adjustment from 8:30am on **Monday, January 11 - Friday, January 15** at 11:59pm. Schedule adjustment will begin again at 7am on the first day of classes, **Tuesday, January 19**. Please note that University offices are closed on Martin Luther King Day, **Monday, January 18**. Graduate students may adjust their schedules from their initial registration through the Add Deadline, **Tuesday, January 26**.

Attention returning students: You will not have access to functionality in the Student Services section in MySlice until you have completed the necessary Contact Information update/review procedures. Please see the instructions outlined in the *Updating Your Records* section (p. 14) for additional information.

SUNY Environmental Science & Forestry Courses

Syracuse University students may register for SUNY/ESF courses provided they meet all course restrictions. Registration is subject to the availability of courses. **Syracuse University students may register for these courses via MySlice, just as they would for a Syracuse University course.**

SUNY Health Science Center Courses

Registration for courses at SUNY Health Science Center is restricted to graduate students. Students should secure the permission of their Syracuse University advisor and the College of Graduate Studies, SUNY Health Science Center, 766 Irving Avenue, before registration. See also *Financial Information, Tuition Policy for SUNY Health Science Center Courses*, in this publication.

University College Courses

Main campus students may register for University College (UC) courses if the desired course is not restricted to UC students, subject to course availability. UC courses are listed after the *Main Campus* section of a course. UC classes are identified by section numbers beginning with "U."

GRADING OPTION SELECTION

Audit

(SEE *ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 6.3.1*)

Students may audit courses with the approval of the appropriate department and the instructor. Although students auditing a course are not responsible for fulfilling all academic requirements of the course, instructors may set requirements or restrictions. The audit option is not available for studio courses offered by the College of Visual and Performing Arts and for courses that require a Proposal for Independent Study. Academic credit is not earned for audited courses, which appear on the transcript with the grading symbol of AU. Audited courses do not fulfill requirements in any degree program, do not calculate toward the GPA, and are not counted as carried credits for determination of enrollment status. See *Financial Information, Auditing* in this publication for related tuition charges.

Procedure: Register for the course. [* Note: Undergraduates for whom this registration brings the total number of credits to more than 19 will not be able to register directly for the course (unless they are enrolled in the Honors Program). Such students, prior to submitting the grading option application, must petition their home college to register over the maximum unit limit of 19 credit hours.] Once registered, complete the Grading Option Application, obtain the signature of the course instructor, and submit the form to the Registrar's Office, 106 Steele Hall. This form must be submitted by the audit deadline, **Tuesday, February 2.**

Pass/Fail or Letter Grade

(SEE *ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 6.4*)

Some University courses are automatically graded pass/fail. In other courses, students may elect a pass/fail grading option. For students who elect the pass/fail option, grades of A through D are converted to Pass (P). In certain pass/fail graded courses, listed on the Grading Option Application, a letter grade option may be requested.

These grading options may not be selected or rescinded after the deadline; however, the course(s) may be dropped in accordance with the drop procedure (see *Schedule Adjustment after Classes Begin*). For additional restrictions that apply to undergraduate students, see *Academic Rules and Regulations*.

Procedure: Register for the course. Complete the Grading Option Application, obtain the signatures required, and submit the form to the Registrar's Office, 106 Steele Hall. This form must be submitted by the Pass/Fail deadline, **Tuesday, February 2.**

Registration for more than 19 credits

(SEE *ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 8.04*)

Honors Program students are eligible to register for more than 19 credits without special approval. Other undergraduates who wish to register for more than 19 credits must petition their home college to do so. (See

Tuition, Fees, and Related Policies for information about related tuition charges.)

Registration for a class outside your (Graduate or Undergraduate) academic career

Students may register for classes that are outside of their career with the approval of the department offering the class and their academic program, school, or college.

Procedure: To register for a 600-or-above-numbered course undergraduates need to submit a petition with approval of the department offering the class and their home school or college. Graduate students can register for 500-level and PED courses without additional approval. To register for other classes below 500-level graduate students need to submit a petition with approval from the department of the class and the student's academic program. Approved petitions must be submitted to the Registrar's Office, 106 Steele Hall, by the Add deadline. (Note that the Petition to the Faculty form will override the career (graduate or undergraduate) restriction only; additional clearance may be needed from the department offering the class.)

Incomplete Grades

(SEE *ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 6.2.2*)

Students who are unable to complete a course within normal time limits because of exceptional circumstances may be eligible to request an Incomplete grade. (Students requesting a Leave of Absence from the University may not receive Incomplete grades.) To receive an Incomplete, the student and instructor must complete the Request for Incomplete Grade form, specifying the reasons, conditions, and time limit for removing the Incomplete. Incomplete grades may not be awarded unless the student has completed sufficient work upon which to base a grade. An Incomplete is calculated as an F in the GPA. Completion of the request form does not guarantee the student will be able to complete course requirements. If the student does not complete the specified work with the original instructor or within the time specified, the student may be unable to make arrangements to remove the Incomplete. A student who does not complete the specified requirements and who is awarded the letter grade specified on the request form does not have the option of later petitioning for a change back to an Incomplete or to a different letter grade. Such students who receive a letter grade and repeat the course at a later time may petition to flag the original grade to remove it from GPA calculation.

Removal of Incomplete Grades

(SEE *ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 6.6.2*)

Incomplete grades are not removed by registering for the course again. Although an instructor may require a student to repeat certain elements of a course to remove an Incomplete grade, the student should not register for the course a second time.

SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY POLICIES

INSTITUTIONAL ACCREDITATION

Syracuse University is chartered by the New York State Board of Regents and accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Professional accreditation for each of the professional colleges and schools accords with the regulations of the appropriate professional association. For further information, contact the dean's office of each school or college.

SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY GRADUATION RATE

In compliance with the federal Student-Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act, and regulations of the US Department of Education, Syracuse University provides the following information to current and prospective students. Of the cohort of full-time degree-seeking undergraduate students who first enrolled at Syracuse University in fall 2002, 80.1% had earned their baccalaureate degrees as of August 2008. These beginning and end dates comprise 150% of the normal length of full-time study (4 years) needed to complete a typical undergraduate degree program. While this calculation meets the Act's requirements for determining a graduation rate, Syracuse University recognizes that many students for diverse reasons are unable or choose not to complete their degrees in a continuous sequence of full-time enrollment. Therefore, the rate may not accurately reflect the commitment and achievement of its students. Moreover, the Act's stipulation that the graduation rate be that of the cohort of entering FULL-TIME students leaves out the significant population of PART-TIME students who constitute an important part of the Syracuse University community.

STUDENT ACADEMIC WORK

In compliance with the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, works in all media produced by students as part of their course participation at Syracuse University may be used for educational purposes, provided that the course syllabus makes clear that such use may occur. It is understood that registration for and continued enrollment in a course where such use of student works is announced constitute permission by the student. After such a course has been completed, any further use of student works will meet one of the following conditions: (1) the work will be rendered anonymous through the removal of all personal identification of the work's creator/originator(s); or (2) the creator/originator(s)' written permission will be secured. As a generally accepted practice, honors theses, graduate theses, graduate research projects, dissertations, or other exit projects submitted in partial fulfillment of degree requirements are placed in the library, University Archives, or department for public reference.

REGISTRATION

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 8.01 AND 8.01.1)
Official Registration Required for Attending Classes. University policy prohibits students from attending, being evaluated, auditing, or otherwise participating in regular semester courses without being officially enrolled. The only exception is for students making up incomplete grades with faculty approval. Faculty may not allow students to attend classes and/or submit work unless students (1) appear on the official class list or (2) present a current copy of their class schedule showing the course to have been added. Adding of courses or entire schedules after the late registration and add deadline may be done by petition only. Students must register for courses in the semester in which they begin work for the course. Attending a class without officially registering and then registering for the course in a subsequent term for reasons of resource, billing, or scheduling convenience is strictly prohibited, for both graduate and undergraduate students. Advisors and faculty should not advise students to take such actions, and students are held to the policy regardless of such advice or permission. If such action occurs and grades are later reported for recording on the transcript, students will be dropped from the later course registration and

retroactively registered in the term during which they actually took the course. The Bursar's Office will charge the appropriate tuition and fees.

ATTENDANCE IN CLASSES

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 2.0)

Attendance in classes is expected in all courses at Syracuse University. Class attendance requirements and policies concerning non-attendance are established by the instructors of each course and are detailed in the course syllabus.

ADMINISTRATIVE DROPS

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 8.1.2.1)

Instructors have the option to drop students who do not attend the first week of class (up to and including the add deadline). If an emergency prevents a student from attending the first week, he/she must contact the instructor before the add deadline to affirm his/her intention to continue in the course. Administrative drops must be completed by the Financial Drop deadline (**Tuesday, February 9**), three weeks from the first day of classes.

RELIGIOUS OBSERVANCES

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 2.1)

It is the policy of Syracuse University that no student should be refused admission or be expelled because he or she is unable to participate in any examination, study, or work requirement because of his or her religious holy day requirements. An opportunity will be provided to make up any examination, study, or work requirements that may have been missed because of an absence due to a religious observance providing that the instructor has been notified in writing one week before the absence. No fees will be charged to the student for the costs incurred by the University for such makeup work. In effecting this policy, the University agrees that no adverse or prejudicial effect should result to any student who avails him- or herself of its provisions.

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 2.1.1)

Yom Kippur is a holiday when it occurs on days when classes meet. Observance begins approximately one hour before sunset on the prior day and ends approximately one hour after sunset on the day of observance. Main Campus and University College (including the branch campuses) classes will be cancelled as follows:

Prior day All classes, whose meeting times extend beyond 6:00 p.m., (start before and end after) or that start after 6:00 p.m. are cancelled.

Observance day All classes (day and evening) are cancelled.

ACCOMMODATIONS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 8.02)

Syracuse University welcomes people with disabilities and, in compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and the Americans with Disabilities Act, does not discriminate on the basis of disability. Upon acceptance to Syracuse University, students with disabilities are strongly urged to discuss academic and nonacademic accommodations with the Office of Disability Services (disabilityservices.syr.edu), 804 University Ave., Room 309; 315-443-4498 (VOICE), and 315-443-1371 (TTY).

READING DAY POLICY

Reading days are designed to allow students the maximum opportunity to prepare for final examinations. Therefore, final examinations and required meetings or classes are not to be held on any reading day. Requests for exceptions to this rule must be approved by the dean of the college and the Associate Provost for Academic Programs, 304 Steele Hall, and must be recorded in the Office of the Registrar.

UPDATING YOUR RECORDS

ADDRESS AND BIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

Addresses and Phone Numbers

Students are required to provide current addresses, phone numbers, and other contact information to the University. This facilitates timely communication on matters of interest to students, such as registration, and prompt communication in emergency situations. Twice each year students, excluding SUNY ESF students, will be prompted to review their contact information before access to Student Services on MySlice will be granted.

Contact information may be reviewed and updated by logging in to MySlice and selecting any of the links in Student Services. You will automatically be forwarded to the items which must be reviewed. You may also select the relevant item(s) under "Personal Information". Students who wish to prevent the release of address and telephone information should refer to the "Student Rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act" (in this publication) or at registrar.syr.edu/students/ferpa.html. Students must file a Request to Prevent Disclosure of Directory Information form with the Office of the Registrar, 106 Steele Hall. Such requests may be filed at any time and will remain in effect permanently (including after departure from the University) unless a change is requested.

Social Security Number

Students who want to change their SSN must present their social security card and SU ID card to the Registrar's Office, 106 Steele Hall.

Name

Students must present one of the following proofs of name change to the Registrar's Office: New social security card together with valid driver's license (both showing the new name); Certificate of Marriage; Court Order.

ACADEMIC AND CURRICULAR CHANGES

All students are responsible for knowing the requirements of their degree program(s). Information regarding curriculum requirements can be obtained from the college deans' offices. Students must petition to obtain a variance in curricular requirements. Petition forms are available in the college deans' offices. Students may not petition for a variance after the first semester of their senior year.

Program of Study (Major) Undergraduate students who wish to declare or to change their program of study must complete a Designation of Official Program of Study form, available in the college deans' offices. All matriculated undergraduate students must apply for admission to and be accepted into a major program of study by the beginning of their junior year. Some colleges require an earlier declaration.

Minors Students must receive approval for admission to a minor from their faculty advisor, the minor coordinator, and their home college. If admission is granted, a Declaration of Minor form must be submitted to the students home college.

Intra-University Transfer Undergraduates, who wish to transfer to a different Syracuse University school or college, including University College, should obtain an Intra-University Transfer form from either their current dean's office or the dean's office in the college to which they want to transfer. Deadlines for transfer vary from college to college. Check with the "new" college for the application deadline date. Undergraduate students who wish to enroll in a second college or withdraw from a second college should follow the procedure for Intra-University Transfer.

Academic Advisor Students who wish to change academic advisors should consult with their home college dean's office.

Honors Program Applications for the Renée Crown Honors Program are available in 306 Bowne Hall. Information about the program can be found in the Undergraduate Catalog.

READMISSION TO OR LEAVE OF ABSENCE FROM THE UNIVERSITY

Readmission Applications for readmission may be obtained from Student Affairs, Dean of Students, Steele Hall, Room 306. Graduate students petition for readmission through their departments.

Leave of Absence A request to take a leave of absence from Syracuse University is initiated in the student's home college dean's office or, for graduate students, in the department office. See related financial information in this booklet.

ENROLLMENT CERTIFICATION: STATEMENT OF FULL- AND PART-TIME STUDENT STATUS

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 17.0 – 17.1.2)

The Registrar's Office, 106 Steele Hall, provides statements of student enrollment status. Statements can be provided for current and past semester, but not for a future semester or summer session. Students may also obtain enrollment verification through MySlice, *Student Services > Enrollment > View Enrollment Verification*. The University's criteria for full- and part-time status are listed below. These criteria are used for the purpose of enrollment certification and athletic activity admission fee eligibility. Separate criteria apply for the calculation of tuition and fees (see *Tuition, Fees, and Related Policies*). Separate criteria also apply for certain types of financial aid, including TAP.

Undergraduate students

Registration for 12 or more credit hours confers full-time academic status on an undergraduate student during a given semester. All other undergraduate students enrolled for fewer than 12 credit hours are considered part-time students.

Graduate students

Full-time status: Satisfaction of the following criteria will confer full-time status on a graduate student during a given semester.

- (1) Registration for 9 credits for spring or fall (or 6 credits during a given summer session) in a program approved by the student's advisor.
- (2) Appointment as a graduate assistant or by holding a Syracuse University Fellowship.
- (3) The student's academic unit (department, program, or college, as appropriate) certifies that the student is pursuing a full-time program of study by virtue of an appropriate combination of activities chosen from among the following: study for preliminary, qualifying, or comprehensive examinations; study to satisfy language or tool requirements; work on a dissertation or thesis; undertaking an internship that equates with at least 9 credits of course work; other special circumstances, as specified and justified by the academic unit.

Under circumstance (2) or (3) above, if the student is not registered for any coursework, including registration for master's thesis or doctoral dissertation credits, he/she must be registered for GRD 998 Degree in Progress.

Law students are required to be enrolled for 12 credits in the spring or fall semester to be in full-time status, as stated in College of Law requirements. In the case of students matriculated in dual degree programs, one of which is the J.D. degree, this requirement for full-time status takes precedence over the 9-credit criterion for full-time status as stated in (1) above.

Part-time status: For the purposes of determining eligibility for government sponsored financial aid programs, part-time graduate students must be matriculated, registered for at least six credits a semester, and making satisfactory academic progress.

GRADUATING STUDENTS

Graduating students notify the University of their intention to graduate through the File Diploma Request process, accessed through MySlice. This process must be completed to ensure inclusion in the degree certification review process and receipt of commencement information and eventually, a diploma.

Undergraduates

The File Diploma Request link becomes available under Student Services for undergraduates upon entry into their degree program. Students must use this link to specify the term in which they intend to graduate and to provide information for their diploma. Students must also contact their home school or college to review all graduation requirements.

Graduate Students

The File Diploma Request link in MySlice is available for graduate students upon entry into their degree programs. In order to prompt a review of their records for graduation, Graduate students expecting to graduate must complete the Final Diploma Request process in MySlice by established deadlines, published as GraduationDeadlines.pdf by the Graduate School. Students may also consult their departments or the Graduate Enrollment Management Center regarding deadlines for filing for graduation and information regarding completion of requirements.

ID CARDS: FACULTY/STAFF, STUDENTS, AND SPOUSES/DEPENDENTS

The ID Card Office is located in 206 Steele Hall. **Cards for new students and new faculty and staff members will be issued at no cost. Lost cards will be replaced at a cost of \$15.00 for the first card and \$25.00 for subsequent cards. There is a \$10.00 charge for a spouse, dependent, or pre-approved domestic partner of faculty or staff, and they must be registered through Human Resources prior to getting a card.** Registration can be completed at Human Resources, Skytop Office Building, Bowne Hall Work Life Center, or Steele Hall Student Employment Services Office. Spouses of students must present a marriage license, and dependents must present a birth certificate along with another form of identification and a valid social security number. The sponsor's currently valid ID must also be presented. Domestic partners of full-time students must be registered with Student Affairs. Spouses or dependents must obtain an ID card prior to purchasing student priced tickets for Carrier Dome events.

Reminder: For admission to Carrier Dome athletic events you must present a valid ID card along with your student or spouse/dependent ticket. Special prices for admission to University athletic contests and events are extended to full-time Syracuse University, SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry students, and their spouses/dependents. Refer to the *Tuition, Fees, and Related Policies* booklet for additional information.

Full-time status: Registration for 12 or more credits confers full-time academic status on an undergraduate student during a given semester.

Part-time status: Students registered for fewer than 12 credits are considered part-time. Part-time status may affect eligibility for University housing and financial aid. For purposes of financial aid, students registered for 6-11 credits are considered half-time students; students registered for 0-5 credits are considered less than half-time.

TRANSCRIPTS

(SEE ACADEMIC RULES AND REGULATIONS 4.0)

Transcripts of courses taken and degrees received at Syracuse University are maintained in the Registrar's Office in accordance with the policies of the American Association of Collegiate Registrar's and Admissions Officers. Official transcripts requested from the Registrar's Office will show the entire record of all coursework, both undergraduate and graduate, matriculated and non-matriculated. The transcript separates semesters of study at the undergraduate level from those at the graduate level. Within that distinction, however, the transcript is not degree-specific; i.e., it does not designate courses that apply to multiple specific degree programs at the same level. Such information may only be obtained from the student's college for undergraduate degrees, or the Graduate School or College of Law for graduate degrees.

Procedure

Transcripts may be obtained in person from the Registrar's Office, 106 Steele Hall, or by mail from the Registrar's Office, 109 Steele Hall, Syracuse, NY 13244-1120. Requests must be made in writing, by mail, or by fax (315) 443-7994, and include the student's signature and the following information:

- name(s) used while attending Syracuse University
- social security number or SU ID
- date of birth
- dates of attendance
- college(s) of enrollment
- degree(s) received, if any, and date of graduation
- address of the person, office, or agency to which the transcript is to be sent and number of copies to be sent to each address

Access to student records is protected by University policy

and federal law. Only students may request copies of their transcripts. No student may obtain a transcript for another student without that student's written authorization. Second parties requesting a transcript will be asked to provide identification. To safeguard students' privacy, no transcript will be sent when the request is made by telephone, cablegram, or email.

Syracuse University reserves the right to withhold the transcripts and diplomas of students who have unfulfilled financial obligations to the University or by request of the Office of Judicial Affairs.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION FOR SPRING 2010

UNIVERSITY PAYMENT POLICY

All accounts must be paid in full on a date established by the University for each semester.

Undergraduate students All charges must be paid in full on or before August 1 for the fall semester, and on or before December 15 for the spring semester or be up to date on a monthly payment plan.

Law students All charges must be paid in full and on or before August 1 for the fall and on or before December 15 for the spring semester or up to date on a monthly payment plan.

Graduate students All charges must be paid by the due date of the billing statement sent in September for fall and in February for spring.

All students must have satisfied all financial obligations to be eligible to register. It is the responsibility of the student who is receiving financial aid from any source to ensure that the financial aid is available prior to the payment deadline. In the event that the financial aid is not available, the student will be required to pay all charges in full and the financial aid will then be credited or refunded upon actual receipt by the University.

REMITTED TUITION BENEFITS

The awarding of remitted tuition is administered by the Office of Human Resources. Up to twelve credit hours of remitted tuition are available each year to full-time benefits eligible faculty and staff. Up to nine credit hours are available to part-time benefits eligible faculty and staff. Eligible retired employees and spouses may continue to receive the same benefit as when actively employed. The spouse or eligible domestic partner of a graduate assistant is eligible for 3 credit hours of remitted tuition per semester, during the GA's appointment period.

Up to all of an employee's remitted tuition may be transferred to his/her legal spouse or eligible domestic partner. Remitted tuition credits are awarded in mid-July each year for use during the fall, spring or summer semesters immediately following. Credits do not carryover from year to year; any credits not used are forfeited. Credit hours may not be borrowed from a future year to be used in a current year.

Remitted tuition may be applied to tuition charges for undergraduate and graduate courses at Syracuse University, or University College. SU reserves the right to restrict the use of remitted tuition for certain, workshops, non-credit courses and special courses. Remitted tuition may not be used for courses offered through SUNY ESF or SUNY UMU, Project Advance, or private instruction. Remitted tuition does not cover fees other than tuition.

Up to six credit hours may be taken by an employee per semester or summer session. An employee may exceed six credit hours in a single semester only with the permission of his/her supervisor. An employee may take classes during regular work hours, with the permission of his/her supervisor.

New employees will be awarded a pro-rated number of credit hours in their first year, based upon date of hire. If an employee terminates during the year, the total year benefit will be pro-rated based upon his or her termination date. If the employee terminates during a semester when remitted tuition benefits were used by the employee or spouse or eligible domestic partner, the employee will be billed for any remaining balance after the pro-rated remitted tuition credits have been applied.

The combination of employee/spouse/eligible domestic partner remitted tuition benefits, graduate tuition or other scholarships, fellowships, and/or department awards, may be applied concurrently toward actual tuition costs up to a maximum of 24 credits in one fiscal year, for classes taken fall semester through the following summer.

Remitted tuition benefits used by a University employee or retiree for graduate-level courses are tax free up to \$5,250.00 per calendar year. RTB used for graduate-level courses in excess of the \$5250.00 limit are

taxable to the employee or retiree and subject to withholding of income taxes by the University at the time the benefit is used.

- Remitted tuition benefits used by the spouse of a University employee or retiree for graduate level courses are taxable to the employee or retiree, and subject to withholding taxes at the time the benefit is used.
- Remitted tuition benefits used by a University employee or retiree, or the spouse of a University employee or retiree for undergraduate courses are tax free.
- Remitted tuition benefits used by the same-sex domestic partner of a University employee for undergraduate and/or graduate level courses are taxable to the employee and subject to withholding taxes at the time the benefit is used.

Advanced Credit Exams

Students will be charged a fee for each course in which an advanced credit examination is given. Credits earned by undergraduates through advanced credit exams may not be included in the 12-19 credit hour range of tuition payment.

Variable Credit Course Tuition Policy

This policy applies to variable credit courses only, that is, courses with VC in the credit hours column.

1. Undergraduate students

A. *Full-time students* will be billed for a minimum of 3 credit hours for every variable credit base course, even if they earn fewer than 3 credits. Students who register for more than 19 credits will be billed for the additional credit hours.

B. *Part-time students* will be billed for a minimum of 3 credit hours for each variable credit base course. Students who register during the semester for modules that total more than 3 credits will be billed for the additional credit hours.

2. **Graduate students** must register for at least one module when they initially register for a variable credit course. Tuition charges will be assessed on a per credit hour basis. Students who register for additional modules during the semester will be billed for the additional credit hours.

Tuition Policy for SUNY Health Science Center

Registration for courses at SUNY Health Science Center is restricted to graduate students. Students who register for such courses will be billed by the Syracuse University Bursar at the Syracuse University graduate per credit hour rate. Syracuse University students may not apply remitted **SPRING 2010** tuition benefits or graduate tuition scholarships to Health Science Center courses unless they are graduate assistants and their department chairperson certifies that the courses are necessary to their degree programs.

Tuition Policy for SUNY ESF Courses Syracuse University students may not apply remitted tuition benefits or graduate tuition scholarships to Forestry courses unless they are graduate assistants and their department chairperson certifies that the courses are necessary to their degree program.

Special Course Fees - 'Fee Required'

Certain courses require the payment of a special fee in addition to tuition. These courses are designated by the statement "Fee Required" under comments. Definition of the fees is available in the offices of the respective deans or academic directors. You may view the fee amount on the individual class detail information when using the Class Search in MySlice.

REFUNDS

Financial Deadlines for Dropping Courses with a Full Refund:

A refund for a dropped course will be determined according to the following schedule:

First week through third week, that is, by **Tuesday, February 9, 2010**
100%
 Fourth week and thereafter, that is, after **Tuesday, February 9, 2010**
none

Add/Drop Refund Policies for Full-time Undergraduate and College of Law Students

There will be no charges or refunds for courses added or dropped within the 12 to 19 credit hour range. Credits added in excess of 19 will be charged on a per credit hour basis. Tuition for credits dropped outside the 12-19 credit hour range will be credited at 100% within the first three weeks of the semester.

After the Third Week of Classes

The financial deadline is three weeks from the first day of classes. Charges for courses added or dropped after the financial deadline will be based on the number of credits for which a student is registered on the day of the financial deadline. Thus, after the financial deadline for dropping courses:

1. No refunds will be given for credits dropped after the financial deadline.
2. Tuition will be charged for all credits added above 19 credit hours regardless of the number of credits dropped.

Example 1

You are registered for 20 credits. After the financial deadline has passed you decide to drop a three-credit course. Although you are now registered for 17 credits, you are not entitled to a refund for the one credit over 19 because you dropped the course after the financial deadline.

Example 2

You are registered for 18 credits. After the financial deadline for dropping courses, you drop a two-credit course and add a three-credit course. Although you are now registered for 19 credits, you will be charged for 21 credits because you are not entitled to a refund for the two credits dropped after the financial deadline.

Example 3

You are registered for 15 credits. After the financial deadline you add a three-credit course. You are now registered for 18 credits; you will not be charged additional tuition because you remained within the 12-19 credit hour range.

POLICY OF ENROLLMENT IN PART-TIME EXTENSION AND CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS OF SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY

A. Any student carrying 12 or more hours in any semester of the regular academic year, or any graduate assistant appointed to a regular half-time (20 clock hours per week) assistantship who is carrying at least nine hours of credit, is defined as a full-time student and shall pay the full-time Main Campus tuition rate, except for University College ISDP students.

B. Full-time students, as defined above, may with the approval of their dean enroll in courses in University College or the Extended Campus through the Main Campus registration. Registration in one or more of these units for courses totaling 12 (9 or more for graduate students) or more hours, however, will result in the University billing the student for the full-time main campus rate.

C. Matriculated students, except those matriculated at University College, may not register for summer courses through the University College registration process, but must register through the Main Campus Summer Sessions process and pay the Summer Sessions rate. They may take University College courses through the tuition transfer procedure upon approval of University College. Transfer of matriculation to University College may not be made for the sole purpose of summer study.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE AND WITHDRAWAL FROM SU

Students must initiate their Leave of Absence from the University at the dean's office of their college. The student then reports to Student Affairs, Dean of Students, Steele Hall, Room 306, to complete the necessary forms. The effective date used to determine refund eligibility is the date determined by the home school or college.

Refunds

1. Any student who takes a leave of absence, who withdraws, drops out, or is suspended or expelled from the University on or after his or her first day of class may be entitled to a refund of unearned tuition and fees. **Please refer to the Tuition and Fees Bulletin for specific details.** It can be found online at bursar.syr.edu
2. Students who take a leave of absence or withdraw for medical reasons must submit medical documentation to one of the following units: Health Services, the Counseling Center, or the Office of Prevention Services (Substance Abuse Prevention and Health Enhancement Program and the University Rape: Advocacy, Prevention, and Education Center), within 60 days of the last date of class attendance to qualify for the special refund consideration we extend under these circumstances (whether student or University-initiated) for tuition only. Otherwise, standard University policies will apply. Medical refunds, excluding the administrative fee of \$100, will be based on the effective date of the leave and will be prorated using the total number of class days in the period of enrollment as the base number for the daily calculation.
3. Students who have submitted documentation indicating they have been called to active duty by any of the United States Armed Forces may request a tuition refund and prorated refund of housing and board charges covering the semester for which they are enrolled.

Tuition refund policies at ESF do not follow the same schedule as mentioned above. Please see the SUNY ESF handbook, your original bill, or contact the ESF bursar's office for the SUNY refund policy.

Auditing

Tuition and fees for auditing courses are the same as those for courses taken for credit, with the following exceptions:

No charge is made for courses audited during a fall or spring semester in which the undergraduate or graduate student is registered as a full-time student (12 or more credit hours exclusive of audit hours for undergraduates and 9 or more credit hours exclusive of audit hours for graduate students). Graduate students who have appointments as graduate assistants, graduate associates, and graduate fellows are eligible to audit courses during the fall and spring semesters at no additional charge.

Students registered for fewer than 12 credits (or 9 for graduate students) will be charged 60% of the undergraduate or graduate tuition rate for courses audited. The level of the student, not the level of the course, determines the tuition rate.

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

Students looking for temporary and part-time employment may obtain information from the Student Employment Office located in Steele Hall, Room 210. This office has information on academic related part-time positions.

NYS TAP AID RECIPIENTS

If you **repeat a course** in which you previously earned a passing grade, it may not count toward the full-time course load required for TAP. Contact the Registrar's Office if uncertain. You must **declare an official major** and have it show on the Student Records System by the beginning of the semester following your achieving **junior class status** -- that is, having 54 total earned credits. The **non-declared major**, e.g., 0013 "Arts and Sciences," or an unofficial major (in colleges that have unofficial majors) will make you ineligible for TAP aid after this point. See the recorder in your college dean's office or your advisor if you have questions.

If you have received 4 semesters of TAP Aid, you must have a cumulative C (2.00) average to be eligible to receive your 5th payment of TAP.
